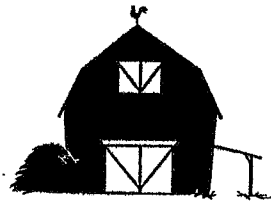
Wes and I have attended many of the zoning board meetings. We have heard a lot of people expressing the pros and cons for the Panther Grove II wind turbines.



My name is Alan Miller, owner of Prairie View Farms, a purebred Angus farm located within the footprint of Panther Grove 2 proposed wind farm in Gridley Illinois.

I was raised in Waldo Township and after attending the University of Illinois and receiving a Bachelor's, Master's and Ph.D. degree in Animal Science, I worked for University of Illinois Extension for 15 years before returning to the farm full time to launch our Angus operation. When I graduated from college there were 25 cows in Gridley, and today we have more than 200 cows at the farm and raise and sell more than 200 calves each year. Our operation's reach extends across North America, as we have sold cattle to Mexico, Canada, and most of the 48 U.S. states.

I am writing to express my unequivocal support for Panther Grove 2's application for this project. I believe that my mix of backgrounds in livestock oriented production agriculture and university research makes me uniquely qualified to speak as someone who understands the science behind some of the impacts of wind turbines on agriculture, and whose farm will directly be impacted by these turbines, I want to make sure you as board members know that I am not concerned to continue to raise my cattle within its footprint any differently than I have in the past 25 years.

As a cattle producer, I follow news about our industry as anyone following their business's industry, and I have yet to see any credible research saying that there will be a negative effect on my cows as a result of these turbines. This is not the first wind farm in the U.S., even the first wind farm in this county, and I firmly believe that the industry has proven itself in its 40-year history in the country. Adding a wind farm to our area will only add economic benefit for those directly impacted by receiving a wind farm on their property, as my mother and aunt will, or secondarily through the impact the company will make on local government entities.

I believe that the economic benefit that will especially be returned to our communities will be positively received by many. Jobs to the area, impacts to the schools, township governments, and other locally based entities will see only positive economic effects of this project. It is vital to me as a business owner who is vested in this community to support programs that will positively impact others.

I encourage you as board members to listen carefully not only to those making noise about this project, but to the science, and financial benefit that this project will make on our area and vote with that in mind.

My name is Bruce Klein. I reside at 111 Trail Ridge Drive in Lexington Illinois.

My first exhortation to you this evening is that with all change and transition, there initially comes some degree of uncomfortableness. My second is that all things have some undesirable characteristics for some people.

My family owns 2 homesteads, 638 acres of farmland and leases an additional 350 acres in Waldo, Pike, Rooks Creek and Indian Grove townships of Livingston County.

Many of my family and work partners as well as my wife and I live in the footprint of the Blooming Grove Wind Field. Our time living in the wind field has only been positive. We do not experience any of the harm or nuisance testified to in these hearings. I live with people who actually find the turbines attractive, like the historical windmills of Holland.

We have a unique natural resource in Central Illinois called wind. I often complain about our constant winds at my work or when I would like to sit and rest outside. Humans need energy. Wind and Solar are great complements, and renewable energy sources. We may or may not care for the aesthetics of these towers. There was resistance to telephone and electric lines when they were new. However, we do not have the issues of living in a fossil fuel footprint, or deal with the complications of fracking or oil sands. If coal mining is in the history of a region, there have been undesirable consequences for that source. Nuclear has proven to be complicated. We don't experience those issues only because we do not live where those resources are.

If we are to bring back manufacturing to the US, which I and the current federal administration, believes we need to do we need more cheap energy to make this happen. It is my understanding the state of IL, particularly the ComEd region is nearing an energy scarcity to meet the short term demand. The state of IL has the largest wind project available to it here in Panther Grove 2 available to start producing cheap energy now and hopefully the County Board will allow this to happen!

A significant majority of those who own, live and work in the proposed footprint of Panther Grove 2, have clearly shown their support by contracting their properties, not just farmland but the 150 plus residences located within 1 mile of a wind turbine. I have one Waldo township landowner who thoroughly considered the contract and decided to decline, so I have listened to perspectives of all through this process. I want to note to you that the employees of Panther Grove 2 were remarkably kind and respectful even when the answer was no, in that experience.

The majority of these three townships have spoken. Yes, for a very minor group a people they may not initially want to look at them eventhough there already is existing wind turbines in the nearby horizon. But that, in our opinion, is small compared to the amount energy and financial benefits this project will bring to the Country and local community.

Dear Chairman Carley,

I am thankful for all the hard work you are putting into the Panther Grove II Wind Project permit hearings. I am especially thankful for my neighbors on both sides of the debate who have come out to participate in these hearings. I have good friends and neighbors who are for and against the project, with the vast majority of the people that I know being supportive.

Thus, I am writing to express my support (and theirs) for the project. We are not the minority in the community.

I have been a taxpaying landowner/tenant farmer in Livingston County for eighteen years. My roots however go deeper than this. I am a fifth-generation farmer in Waldo Township. I was raised in the Gridley community, studied Agricultural Economics at the University of Illinois, and after graduating served as a vocational pastor in the Southeast before returning home to the farm in 2007 to carry-on our family legacy with the land.

My family and I made the decision to participate in the project when it was presented for several reasons:

1. First, we find them aesthetically pleasing. I know that may sound strange. But in my opinion beauty is not merely subjective (i.e., in the eye of the beholder). Things have hidden value and thus can become pleasing when we come to appreciate and behold the good they provide. In other words, God has made the Prairie to grab our attention and create awe. But the towering mills are not a blight upon the land. They are reminders of how God made the world and provides for us. Which leads me to my second point.
2. Second, we value the benefits of renewable energy. I personally believe that God created a world equipped with cycles that replenish used resources. And so, if water, solar power, and biomass can be used without diminishing their value I am of the opinion that we should do our best to wisely invest in them and mirror this cycle that He established.
3. Third, and lastly, the rural community of which my family has been a part of since the 1800s is rapidly changing, and in my opinion not for the better. Homes are fewer and farther apart. Many are homesteads for commuters. And the families that make their livelihoods on the land are hurting financially. When I was a student at the University of Illinois (1991 alum) one of my Ag professors said, "If you farm for 40 years, 80% of your equity will be made in 5 good years. The rest are break even, at best." That's why most farmers have winter jobs and their wives work off the farm. The Panther Grove II Wind Project is arriving at the downturn of what many say will be some long and lean years in the rural community. Our schools depend upon the livelihood of landowners. Wind energy provides some stability and strikes a good balance between protecting the future of local agriculture while harvesting homegrown energy for the benefit of our schools, economy, and energy system.

Thank you for taking the time to read this letter. And again, thank you for all the good work you are doing for Livingston County.
